SUPPORT FOR MELAB, IELTS, UKCAT & OTHER PROFICIENCY TESTS

For example, the MELAB is often used by universities to determine an international student's English language proficiency. It is broken down into several components:

- Listening
- Grammar
- Cloze (word choice and usage)
- Vocabulary
- Reading Comprehension
- Speaking

Each section demands consistent practice and skill building, some of which is not available during regular class times. As such, AIA is prepared to offer additional support to ensure students find success on these exams.



OUR COMMUNITY


AIA is located at McCowan Road and Finch Avenue, a densely populated area close to the border of the City of Markham and Scarborough.



AP or Advanced Placement classes are created by the College Board, a company internationally recognized as creating courses and exams to assess the best and brightest of today's students.



ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)

In essence, an AP course is designed to mimic the complexity of topics that would be discussed at the first year level of university. For example, the topics discussed in grade 12 AP Mathematics would be similar to the topics covered in first year mathematics. As such, a student who completes an AP course with a high score has effectively proven their capacity to succeed and thrive in university. AP courses are delivered only by qualifying schools. The curriculum for AP courses is created by subject matter experts. Generally, AP courses do not have individual assignments that are marked and reported on a report card; instead, they conclude with a major exam that tests all aspects of the course.

How do we incorporate AP at AIA?

After AIA receives approval from the College Board to deliver AP courses, AIA's instructors will be trained in the specific materials of the course. The student will earn the corresponding credit (assuming he or she passes the course) and then will be given the opportunity to write the AP exam. If the student scores well on the exams, post-secondary institutions are likely to look guite favourably at the student.

Some universities, in fact, will allow a student to skip the first year introductory course (be it mathematics, physics, English, etc) if the student has scored excellent on the respective AP course. For example, if a student completes AP English and scores 95% on the AP English exam, he or she may not have to do first year English, and may proceed directly into second year English. In total, AP courses ensure that students are taught to a higher standard. This standard is determined by a huge number of experts in the field. As a result, AP courses are guite demanding.

THE QUADMESTER SYSTEM

AIA does not follow the traditional year-long single semester or two semester system most day schools use. Instead, we operate on what we call the "quadmester" system. This division creates four separate "quads":

Quad 1: Sept 22nd - Dec 1st

Quad 2: Dec 2nd – Feb 14th

Quad 3: Feb 15th - April 25th

Quad 4: April 26th – June 30th

In each quad, students will be enrolled in 3 courses. This results in the completion of 12 courses at the end of the year, opposed to just 8. This allows students to place meaningful spare periods, take part in

available tutoring slots, study groups, or language enrichment non-credit courses. Given that many of our students are international students, the extra time and increased availability for support classes is beneficial.

While some students may think the workload is much greater, taking 12 courses in an academic year, it's importance to remember the benefits of only focussing on 3 courses per quad instead of 4. It's also important to consider that the quad system results in early graduation.

If possible, it might be nice to use an 8 month calendar to indicate the length of each guad, perhaps using a colour code of some kind.

FACILITIES AND STAFF

AIA hosts several large classroom and several smaller rooms for small group instruction, quiet study, and tutoring.

We also have a functional computer lab and campus wide wireless internet for students.

Our staff is composed of Ontario Certified Teachers and subject-matter experts with the appropriate training. Our administration ensures that all teachers participate in routine professional development activities to keep up with the latest developments in education.

HOME STAY AND ACCOMMODATIONS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

AIA screens its custodians very carefully and ensures that they are caring, genuine individuals with appropriate qualifications to supervise the well being of several international students.

During their home stay, students will have to assume certain responsibilities such as house work and meal preparation for themselves, ensuring the growth of their autonomy.

The placement of home stay accommodations is strategic; students will have easy access to school but also to nearby transit and other local attractions.



International students will naturally need a place to stay during their educational experience in Ontario. AIA will assist students in finding appropriate housing. For students who are minors (under the age of 18), AIA will work with our international recruiting partners to secure appropriate custodians to act as guardians.
